Commonwealth Corps Community Food Resource Coordinator



The mission of the Commonwealth Corps service internship program is to engage Massachusetts residents of all ages, backgrounds, and identities in direct service to strengthen communities, address critical needs, and increase volunteerism. Through hands-on experience, Commonwealth Corps members gain professional skills and valuable knowledge while positively impacting diverse communities in our state.

The Massachusetts Service Alliance (MSA) is a private, nonprofit agency that oversees the program and supports host site partners and members to find success throughout the program year. The three Commonwealth Corps members with the Somerville Homeless Coalition's Project SOUP will serve 10 months in a half-time capacity. They will join a diverse corps of members across Massachusetts who share a common desire to discover their passion and build their network in service to their communities and the Commonwealth.

Project SOUP is the food assistance program of the Somerville Homeless Coalition. Founded in 1969, the program's mission is to promote food security for all in our community by providing free, healthy, and culturally appropriate groceries and meals to Somerville residents and people experiencing homelessness. The Community Food Resource Coordinator will support our community meal operated in collaboration with the Somerville Food Security Coalition, including increasing community engagement and working to share community food resources through the meal program and the Coalition.

What You'll Do:

Essential Responsibilities:

- Complete a minimum of 750 hours of service, serving through June 24, 2023.
- Attend a minimum of 6 Commonwealth Corps trainings and service events held by MSA post orientation.
- Participate in a minimum of 30 minutes of MSA-related activities each week. This may include filling out timesheets, completing a bi-monthly reflection or check-in, or other MSA-related tasks or activities.
- Assist twice a month at the Come to the Table community meal program on Wednesday evening.
- With support from the Somerville Food Security Coalition Co-Leads, promote engagement from community organizations in the meal program and develop a plan to engage multiple chef partners.
- Assist to plan and implement a program evaluation, using a survey tool and qualitative research methods.

Marginal Responsibilities:

- Design flyers and other communications to share food resources in Somerville.
- Attend monthly coalition meetings to stay informed about food security, benefits, and nutrition programming and policies.
- Be a part of the greater Commonwealth Corps community, including participating in cross-site learning groups, writing a short profile for the CC newsletter, connecting with other members on our online platforms, and attending optional social/service events.

Who You Are:

You must be:

- A Massachusetts resident (see guidelines here) with legal authorization to work in the U.S.
- 18 years of age at minimum (member age range is 18 70+ years old)
- Excited to give back to your community and interested in developing your skills and gaining new professional experiences
- Able to balance service internship commitments with personal commitments in a sustainable way
- Interested in understanding issues from at a systemic level and in promoting connections between stakeholders to address issues collaboratively

- Able to communicate professionally in English via email
- Dedicated to equity, particularly to making adequate, healthy, culturally/dietarily appropriate food economically and physically accessible to all
- Comfortable on your feet for 3 hours at a time in a space that may not be well heated

It would also be great if you:

- Have experience or familiarity with evaluation research, especially surveys and/or qualitative methods such as key informant interviews and focus groups
- Have experience with social media, either personally or professionally
- Have experience with managing a budget, including helping to track expenditures, either personally or professionally
- Speak a language other than English -- multilingual candidates encouraged to apply, especially Spanish,
 Portuguese, and Haitian Creole speakers

What You'll Get:

- Stipend of \$550 semi-monthly while in service, up to \$11,550, minus taxes and withholdings;
- Member assistance program, including unlimited, confidential, 24/7, phone counseling services and up to three free, in-person counseling sessions, plus a lot more;
- Completion award of up to \$2000 upon successful completion of service, minus taxes and withholdings;
- Reimbursement for outside training or professional development opportunities relevant to member's service and/or goals (Up to \$100; Dependent on approval from MSA)
- Access to biweekly food basket on an informal basis, as available at the food pantry and community meal programs
- Access to conversational Spanish classes for pantry volunteers and staff and informal language practice in Spanish, Portuguese, and Haitian Creole
- Extensive training from MSA with a diversity, equity and inclusion focus and other professional development opportunities;
- Limited reimbursement for travel to Corps-wide MSA-sponsored activities;
- Internet reimbursement up to \$50/month while required to complete some service from home;
- Limited travel reimbursement from their host site for certain service-related travel away from their usual service location, according to that agency's policies;
- Mental Health/Personal Day once per month counting towards 4hrs
- The opportunity for at least 5 days of planned absences (may include holidays, does not count towards hours requirement);

Please note that receipt of these stipends/benefits may impact an individual's eligibility for certain public benefits.

Term of Service:

- Position Start Date: August 22, 2022
- Position End Date: June 24, 2023
- Service commitment 20 hours per week during the following time windows: Monday 8-12, Tuesday 10-5, Wednesday 9-4, Thursday 10-7, and Friday 9-4. The role would require service on a minimum of three separate days and fully in-person service is preferred.

How to Apply:

Accepted members will be required to undergo a criminal history check.
